
I use the website phys.mrgravell.com to record what we have done in class. How useful do you find this?

I find it a helpful way to get an overview of what we did in class. However, it would be more useful if the notes from the lesson were also there.


It's very helpful as it refreshes what you learnt in the lesson and has the information in case you missed the lesson.

but you don't tell us whether we need our textbook or not so i end up taking all of my stuff home which is heavy


Easy to forget about



Notes make revision so much easier, they are more condensed than the textbook

Not everyone finds all things we do 'easy'

Writing notes is beneficial as it means we do not have to write notes out when revising - instead we can simply read over past notes to refresh our understanding.

I agree this a more active way of learning although if we wrote notes in the lesson, we could more easily check the meaning of something we didn't understand.

I like this method but feel we could make a few more brief notes just to make sure it is in our head properly but I like doing the bulk of the notes in hw time so we can always refer to our notes for revision and to consolidate what we learnt in the lesson.

Though videos are good, concise and brief class summary notes are too.

it is very useful to have notes, but I would find it even better to have them printed out on sheets (although this might make a lot of work for teachers.) I also worry that the notes will not be comprehensive and detailed enough.

- We could come up with questions we wanted answered, and wouldn't have a teacher around to answer them or could be unable to remember the questions in the following lesson. - Often this isn't a problem. We don't rarely spend lots of time in lessons copying down notes - usually the notes are brief. - I find it useful writing down notes in lessons and then having them be explained and expanded on by the teacher as it often increases my understanding of a topic.

writting notes in class is the best as it can be explained by the teacher

i don't always think my notes are exactly what we need to know because i don't have the course



I think that some notes are important to revise from which is what we are currently doing in lessons


the lessons are easier to learn from.

Independent learning can be challenging especially regarding concentration. I prefer class lessons and discussions.


this sounds like a good idea but I don't understand how it works.
